

### WHAT IS NAWCA?

NAWCA, or the North American Wetlands Conservation Act, was passed in 1989 to protect, restore, and enhance wetland habitats for birds. In the past two decades, NAWCA has supported 3,300 projects for over 7,000 partners, conserving more than 32.6 million acres of vital habitat. These efforts have been made possible through \$2.28 billion in grants and an additional \$4.53 billion in partner contributions.

#### **ABOUT THE GRANTS PROGRAM**

The NAWCA program provides matching grants to wetlands conservation projects in the United States, Canada, and Mexico. There is a Standard and a Small Grants Program (see below). Both are competitive grants programs and require that grant requests be matched by partner contributions at no less than a 1-to-1 ratio.

### DOES MY PROJECT QUALIFY?

DOES IT INVOLVE LONG-TERM PROTECTION, RESTORATION, AND/OR ENHANCEMENT OF WETLANDS AND ASSOCIATED UPLANDS HABITATS?

If YES, your project may qualify for a NAWCA grant.

If NO, you may not be eligible and may need to seek other funding.

# SHOULD I APPLY FOR A STANDARD OR SMALL GRANT?

- Standard Grants
  - Provides project funds up to \$3,000,000
  - Deadlines in February and July
- Small Grants
  - Provides project funds up to \$250,000
  - Deadline in October

BOTH STANDARD AND SMALL GRANTS REQUIRE A MINIMUM 1:1 MATCH.
